



2009 Influenza Vaccinations

Effective 10/21/09 and Until Further Notice

Prince George's County Health Department is offering H1N1 Influenza vaccinations to the general public **by appointment only and based on the following priority groups** and are **subject to appointment and vaccine availability**.

Vaccine quantities vary daily based on the amount of vaccine supplied by the State of Maryland to local health departments, and the amounts used per day.

SCHOOL CHILDREN Students in public elementary, middle and high school will be vaccinated by the Health Department for both H1N1 and seasonal flu; private school students will also be provided vaccinations; for more information parents should contact their child's school. <p>Those who should <u>NOT</u> get this vaccine, or should wait:</p> <p>Anyone who has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a severe (life-threatening) allergy to eggs, or to any other substance in the vaccine <p>Those with a moderate or severe illness, should wait until recovering before getting the vaccine</p> <p>Medical staff can advise if you have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> had a life-threatening allergic reaction after receiving a dose of seasonal flu vaccine ever had Guillain Barré Syndrome (a severe paralytic illness also called GBS) 	<p>Those who should <u>NOT</u> get this vaccine, or should wait:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> children younger than 2, and adults 50 years and older pregnant women <p>Anyone who has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a severe (life-threatening) allergy to eggs, or to any other substance in the vaccine had a life-threatening allergic reaction after receiving a dose of seasonal flu vaccine children younger than 5 with asthma or one or more episodes of wheezing within the past year people who have long-term health problems anyone with certain muscle or nerve disorders anyone with a weakened immune system children or adolescents on long-term aspirin treatment <p>Those with a moderate or severe illness, should wait until recovering before getting the vaccine</p> <p>Medical staff can advise if you have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> had a life-threatening allergic reaction after receiving a dose of seasonal flu vaccine ever had Guillain Barré Syndrome (a severe paralytic illness also called GBS)
