REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 2018

CALL MEETING TO ORDER:

The Regular Meeting of the Bowie City Council was held on Tuesday, September 4, 2018 in the Council Chambers at City Hall. Mayor Robinson called the meeting to order at 8:02 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG:

Mayor Robinson led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

QUORUM:

In attendance were Mayor Robinson, Councilmembers Esteve, Gardner, Glass, Truth and Woolfley; Assistant City Manager Mears, City Clerk Hernandez, City Attorney Levan and the Public.

CITY BOARDS AND COMMITTEES:

A. Appointments/Reappointments/Swearing-in

1. Councilmember Glass made a motion to appoint Marian Thomas to the Arts Committee. Councilmember Truth seconded the motion. Motion passed 6-0.
2. Mayor Pro Tem Gardner made a motion to appoint Stephen Wehrenberg to the Environmental Advisory Committee and the Green Team Committee. Councilmember Truth seconded the motion. Motion passed 6-0.
3. Mayor Robinson swore-in Mr. Wehrenberg to his respective committees. Ms. Thomas was not present for swearing-in.

COUNCIL ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Mayor Robinson on behalf of Council thanked staff for the excellent concerts that were held during the summer months at Allen Pond Park.

Councilmember Truth asked City Clerk Hernandez if the City is now in compliance with providing meetings with Closed Captioning. OLD BUSINESS:

A. Adoption of Ordinance O-7-18 Amending Chapter 5, "Building and Property Maintenance", of the City of Bowie Code, Article II, "Housing and Property Maintenance Code", Section 5-11, "Unfit Dwellings", With Respect to the Requirements for Habitability of a Dwelling Unit – Assistant City Manager Mears explained that this ordinance was created by the request of the City's Code Compliance Department to change ambiguous language within Section 5-11, clarifying that a building or structure must have electrical and water service to be considered a habitable dwelling.

Councilmember Truth asked if these changes have been done in other municipalities. City Attorney Levan responded that most municipalities follow the International Building Code laws, the City many years ago, decided to create their own code enforcement laws.

Public Hearing:

Since there were no speakers signed up to speak, the Mayor declared the Public Hearing to have been held.

Mayor Pro Tem Gardner made a motion to adopt Ordinance O-7-18. Councilmember Esteve seconded the motion. Motion passed 6-0.

ADJOURNMENT AND MOVE TO CLOSE SESSION:

Mayor Pro Tem Gardner moved to adjourn the Regular City Council meeting and move to Close Session Statutory Authority to Close Session, General Provisions Article, §3-305(b)(7): To consult with counsel to obtain legal advice. Councilmember Truth seconded the motion and it carried 6-0. The meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

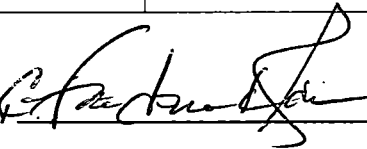
