#### Traffic Calming Measures for Belair Drive and Beaverdale Lane

In the next few weeks, street construction activity will begin on Beaverdale Lane and Belair Drive. Workers will be installing traffic calming measures on both streets to reduce speeds and hopefully to discourage some cut through traffic from MD 450 and MD 3. Three speed humps will be installed on Beaverdale Lane. The Belair Drive work will be done in two phases. The first phase, from Beechtree Lane to Kenhill Drive will begin this spring and will include speed cushions, raised crosswalks, and stop signs at Kenhill Drive and at Stonybrook Drive. The Belair Drive Phase 1 Plan was first presented to stakeholders in 2017. Phase 2, which will address new measures from Kenhill Drive to Annapolis Road (MD 450), is still in the planning stages. Community input will be sought before it moves forward.

#### **Code Corner – Exterior Home Maintenance**

When the weather turns warm, it is a great time to plan for a "spring cleaning". Your home's constant exposure to the elements can leave it looking dirty. Exterior siding can accumulate dirt, grime or stains from pollen, bird droppings or rust. In shady, moist areas, mold and mildew can grow. The City Code requires that all exterior home surfaces be "...free of moss, mold, mildew, rust, corrosion ..." Power washing non-painted surfaces is an easy way to maintain a home's exterior. #### **Keep the Lights On – Report Streetlight Outages**

The City is responsible for the maintenance of most streetlights in Bowie and uses a contractor to perform the repairs. We need your help to identify and report where the lights are out or malfunctioning. There are several ways you can do this:

- Use our 24-hour service request system on the City website (www.cityofbowie.org)

No matter what method you use to report the problem, please be prepared to provide:

- The address nearest the pole
- The pole number (found about five feet up the pole)
- Your name and contact information so we can follow-up with you or obtain further information if necessary.

It is our goal to have street light outages repaired within two business days of notification. However, when a pole has been knocked down it could take up to five business days to get it replaced, and when the repair involves a problem with the underground cable supplying power to the pole, it may take up to seven business days to complete, since it requires locating all the underground utilities in the area before digging can begin.
