City of Bowie Election Results

A non-partisan municipal election was held on Tuesday, November 5, 2019 in the City of Bowie. Residents cast votes for Mayor, two At-Large Councilmembers, and a District Councilmember. There were a record number of candidates running in this election, with every seat in the election contested except District 2.

Tim Adams was elected Mayor, replacing outgoing Mayor Robinson who retired this year after serving as Mayor since 1998. Voters chose Henri Gardner and Ingrid Harrison as the two At-Large Councilmembers. The District winners are Michael Esteve (District 1), Dufour Woolfley (District 2), Adrian Boaf (District 3), and Roxy Ndebumadu (District 4).
