COVID-19 Testing

- Summer Hours to Begin at State-Operated Testing Sites.** The Six Flags America testing site will be open on Wednesday, June 10 and Friday, June 12 from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. each day. No appointment or doctor’s order is required to get a test at the Six Flags America site. Patients who are tested at state-operated sites will be contacted with their results, typically within two to five days.
- Now More Than 150 Testing Sites Statewide.** With expanded capacity and supplies available, the state has broadened the criteria for COVID-19 testing to include those who are asymptomatic. Visit the [state coronavirus website](#) to find a location that is most convenient for you.
- Prince George’s County Health Department is opening up two new appointment-only testing sites.** A site in Chillum opens this week, and another will open next week in Laurel.

Prince George's County Moves to Modified Stage Two on Monday, June 15

On June 11, County Executive Angela Alsobrooks announced Prince George's County will move to a Modified Stage Two Reopening on June 15 at 5 p.m. with the following changes in place:

- Retail stores may reopen to in-store customers with safeguards and capacity limits
- Barbershops and hair salons may open by appointment only, and at 50% capacity with the use of personal protective equipment (PPE) for employees and masks for customers.
- All other personal services - nail salons, massage, and spas - may open by appointment only, and at 50% capacity with the use of PPE and with strong safeguards and physical distancing in place. Customers must also wear face masks.
- Restaurants may open for indoor and outdoor seating, as allowed under MD guidelines. No more than 6 per table, and no more than 50 people per establishment, regardless of space. All CDC guidelines must be followed. All employees must receive health screenings prior to their shift and wear face masks.
- Houses of worship may open for indoor services not to exceed 25% capacity. Outdoor and drive-in services are permitted.
- Childcare facilities may open for essential employees and employees returning to work in Phase 2
- Youth sports may resume in small groups.
- Public and private outdoor pools may open at 25% capacity, and while practicing strict social distancing guidelines. Indoor pools remain closed.
- Gyms, fitness centers, and other indoor fitness activities remain closed.
- Parks are open for personal fitness and fitness classes, including all parks, fields, tennis courts, tracks, and golf courses. Low contact sports are allowed as well.
- Car washes may open with automated systems and with restrictions for where customers can be.
- Some Prince George's County Government employees will return to work and more County services will resume. Teleworking is still encouraged, where possible.

Please note: While Stage Two is a large step forward for Prince George's County, it still may not put the County completely in synch with the Governor's announcement on June 10. The information above was shared during the County Executive's press conference. More details are likely to be provided in the Prince George's County Executive Order when it is released on Monday, June 15.

The City of Bowie will review the Executive Order when it is issued and then determine what steps City government can take to reopen under Prince George's County's Modified Stage Two Reopening.

Reopening Steps Across Maryland as of Friday, June 12 at 5 p.m. (Prince George's rules may be different.)

- Indoor dining can resume at 50% capacity with distancing, and following [strict public health requirements](#).
- Outdoor amusements, rides, miniature golf and go-kart tracks may resume operations with appropriate [health and safety protocols](#).
- Outdoor graduation ceremonies can be held with some capacity restrictions and social distancing measures in place.

More changes will go into effect next Friday, June 19 at 5 p.m.

- Indoor gyms and other indoor studio fitness activities such as dance studios and martial arts, may

- begin to safely reopen at 50% capacity with [strict health, distancing and sanitization measures](#).
- Casinos, arcades and bingo halls can begin to resume operations, with strict safety protocols.

County Reopens Hazardous Waste & Electronics Sites & Hosts Bulk Trash Drop Off Days

The Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics Recycling Acceptance sites at the Brown Station Landfill in Upper Marlboro will reopen on June 11. These sites are open Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Visit environment.mypgc.us for a list of acceptable items.

For the next several weeks, Prince George’s County will also be operating bulk trash drop off collection sites throughout the county on specific dates. [View details and schedule](#). City residents are eligible to take advantage of these drop off sites even though trash collection service is provided by the city government.

MODIFIED BULKY TRASH SERVICES

Beginning Thursday, June 11, DoE will operate nine (9) bulky trash drop-off sites on a biweekly, rotating schedule to reopen services suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Residents may bring up to eight (8) bulky trash items for disposal at all modified drop-off locations.
- Due to restrictions, County employees are not allowed to assist, handle, or touch any bulky trash items brought to the sites.

Bulk Pickup Rules Return to Pre-COVID 19 State Starting July 1, 2020

Modified rules have been in place for trash and recycling since the COVID-19 pandemic began. These modifications were implemented in an effort to protect the City's solid waste personnel while maintaining modified service. Many thanks to residents for their understanding and cooperation in complying with the temporary rules.

Starting July 1, 2020, collection of bulk and large metal items will resume as they were done prior to the COVID-19 pandemic:

- Bulk items are large items that cannot fit in a trash can or bag; items include sofas, mattresses, tables, etc.
- Bulk items may be set alongside your regular trash on the normal trash collection days.
- Large metal items - metal furniture, appliances, grills (no tanks) - will be collected on Wednesdays by appointment only. Call 301-809-2344 or visit www.cityofbowie.org/servicerequest to schedule an appointment.
- Small metal items that can fit in a trash can, should be disposed of in that way.

Residents are asked to continue to exercise care to ensure health and safety when setting out trash. Other than large bulk items, all trash should be in closed bags or in a trash can with a lid. Medical waste and human or animal waste should always be double bagged. Glass should be protected to limit possibility of injury to collectors.
