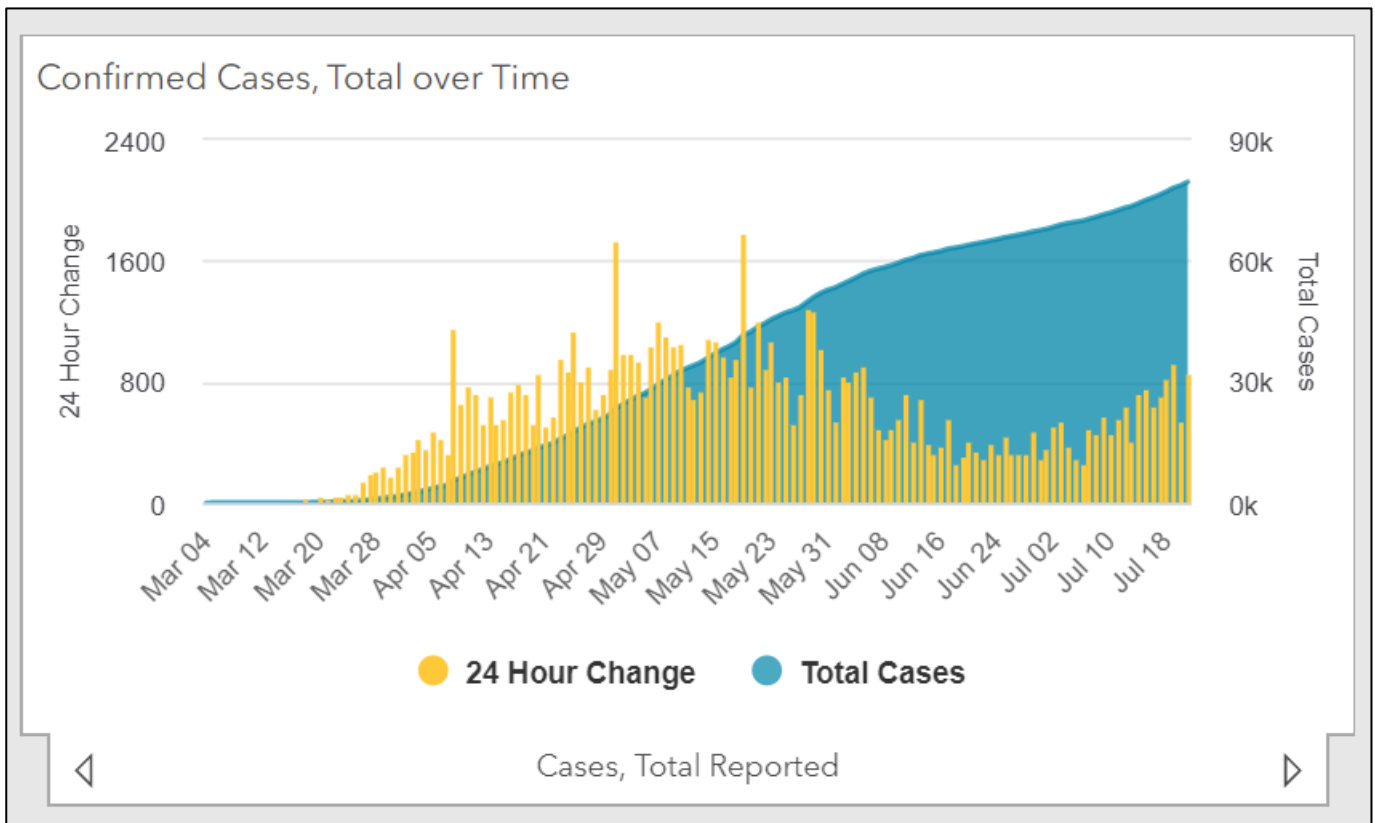
## Maryland Update

The number of new cases in Maryland and the number of hospitalizations related to COVID19 are trending upward. There are many more young adults testing positive than there were in the early months of the pandemic and more than half of the new cases are from those living in the greater Baltimore area.

The state of New York has added Maryland to the Tri-State Quarantine List of 31 states whose visitors are required to quarantine for 14 days when they enter New York, New Jersey, or Connecticut. In other words, Marylanders arriving in the tri-state area must self-quarantine in the state before going out in public.

Multiple news sources are reporting today that health officers from Baltimore City and Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Howard, Montgomery, and Prince George’s Counties have sent a joint letter to the Maryland Health Department asking the state to consider reinstating some of the COVID-19 restrictions that were previously in place to control the spread of the virus.
