Key	
<b>Cases</b>	Represents the daily number of new positive cases.
<b>Positivity Rate</b>	The 7-day positivity rate is a rolling weekly average of the percent of new cases relative to the number of tests conducted. The goal is a positivity rate consistently below 5%.
<b>Cases per 100K persons</b>	Measures how widespread the virus is in a community. The goal is to have fewer than 5 new cases per 100K persons.
<b>Infection rate</b>	Shows how many people are infected by each positive case. The goal is an infection rate at or below 0.9.
<b>Data sources:</b> Except for the infection rate, all data provided here is from the State of Maryland's COVID dashboard. The infection rate is tracked by <a href="http://www.covidactnow.org">www.covidactnow.org</a> . It is subject to adjustments and may have a 1 to 3-day lag time in reporting.	

### COVID Data Trends

There are concerns about the number of new cases climbing in much of the country, possibly signaling the beginning of the predicted fall surge.

### **Maryland Wants to See Your Mask**

Governor Larry Hogan announced the launch of the *#MasksOnMaryland Challenge* in partnership with the Maryland Department of Health. To support the State’s ongoing health and economic recovery, Governor Hogan is challenging all residents, communities, local organizations, and businesses to participate by posting a picture or video wearing a mask to social media with the hashtag #MasksOnMaryland.

### **Drive-Up Flu Shot Clinics for Seniors on November 7 and November 13, 10 a.m. – 2 p.m.**

There will be two no-cost, drive-up flu shot clinics at the Bowie Senior Center. The clinic on November 7 will be in partnership with the Bowie Health Center (University of Maryland Capital Region Health). The vaccine for the November 13 clinic will be provided by the Prince George’s County Health Department. Currently, the only option available at the clinics is for the regular dose which is typically recommended for those under 65 years old. Check with your doctor to determine if a high dose is recommended and where it is available.

### **Food Giveaways**

Over the next several weeks, the City of Bowie will be distributing emergency food supplies to those in need at five upcoming events. The first event is this Saturday, October 17 at Rockledge Elementary School from 11 a.m. until 2 p.m. or until all food is given away. Each family will receive non-perishable items, including ingredients for a selection of meals. Funding for this program comes from the CARES Act.

Recipients should bring identification, a piece of mail addressed to your City of Bowie address, and a mask and remain in their vehicle when they arrive. Staff will verify eligibility, and volunteers will load food into vehicles. For your safety, volunteers will wear masks and gloves.

*Note: Only City of Bowie residents are eligible for this program. Each recipient will be required to show identification and a piece of mail with a Bowie address on it in order to participate.*

## Election Information

### *Mail-in Voting:*

If you have already requested a mail-in ballot:

- Monitor your mailbox. The mailing of mail-in ballots is underway.
- Once you receive your ballot, fill it out completely, place it in the return envelope, sign the voter oath on the envelope, and seal the envelope.
- Return it to a secure ballot drop box located throughout the County by 8 p.m. on November 3, or via mail with a postmark on or before November 3. A secure ballot drop box has now been placed outside the City Gymnasium and is being guarded 24/hours a day.
