COVID Data Trends

Yesterday, the US topped 60,000 new cases in a single day for the first time since August and Maryland reported over 700 new cases. The County positivity rate is still above 5%, however no new COVID-related hospitalizations or deaths were reported for Prince George's County today.

The number of cases has risen recently in Europe, causing governments to take measures to tighten up restrictions and limit socializing in restaurants, bars and other venues.

CDC Refines Guidance about Who is Most Susceptible to COVID-19

On October 6, the CDC revised its information about who is most at risk of severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19. The changes reflect recent data regarding adults who are overweight or who smoke or have a history of smoking. The guidance about the risk to children with underlying medical conditions was also revised to qualify the language more. It now says certain conditions **might increase risk**. The CDC says this was done to better reflect the quality of current available data and does not imply that children are not at risk.

Vaccine Trials Update

Johnson and Johnson's late stage COVID vaccine trial has been temporarily halted due to an unexplained illness in one of those involved in the trial until it can be determined if the illness is related to the vaccine. An independent Data Safety Monitoring Board, which oversees the trial, will review the case and determine if it is safe to resume the trial. This marks the second of four Phase 3 trials that are currently on hold.

Halloween 2020

The City of Bowie will follow the recommendations of the CDC and the Prince George's County regarding Halloween. This means **we strongly recommend against traditional door-to-door trick or treating or trunk or treat events this year.**



Food Giveaways

Over the next several weeks, the City of Bowie will be distributing emergency food supplies to those in need at five upcoming events. The first event is this Saturday, October 17 at Rockledge Elementary School from 11 a.m. until 2 p.m. or until all food is given away. Each family will receive non-perishable items, including ingredients for a selection of meals. Funding for this program comes from the CARES Act.

Recipients should bring identification, a piece of mail addressed to your City of Bowie address, and a mask and remain in their vehicle when they arrive. Staff will verify eligibility, and volunteers will load food into vehicles. For your safety, volunteers will wear masks and gloves.

Note: Only City of Bowie residents are eligible for this program. Each recipient will be required to show identification and a piece of mail with a Bowie address on it in order to participate.

Food Programs

Vehicle Emissions Testing to Resume

The Maryland Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Administration (MDOT MVA) announced the reopening of all Vehicle Emissions Inspection Program (VEIP) stations statewide beginning October 19. VEIP stations have been closed since March, and during the closure many stations were used as drive-through COVID-19 testing sites.

What Parents Need to Know About COVID-19 Symptoms in Children

Below are some tips that the Fairfax County Health Department has compiled for parents about COVID-19 symptoms in children:

- **Children often have similar symptoms of COVID-19 as adults;** In children, symptoms are frequently mild and appear similar to colds, strep throat or allergies. Most commonly, children with COVID-19 have fever or cough. Children are also more likely than adults to show symptoms of vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain and other gastrointestinal problems.
- **Watch for Severe Symptoms:** Some children do get severely ill from COVID-19. Babies under one year of age and children with certain underlying conditions may be more likely than other children to have severe illness from COVID-19. Monitor and seek emergency care if any of the following emergency warning signs are observed:
- **Trouble breathing;** Pain or pressure in the chest that doesn't go away; New confusion; Can't wake up/stay awake when not tired; Bluish lips/face; and Severe abdominal pain.
- **Don't Ignore the "Little Things":** Call a healthcare provider to discuss whether a child needs to be evaluated or tested for COVID-19. Fairfax County

Mail-in Voting:

If you have already requested a mail-in ballot:

- When you receive your ballot, fill it out completely, place it in the return envelope, sign the voter oath on the envelope, and seal the envelope.
- Return it to a secure ballot drop box located throughout the County by 8 p.m. on November 3, or via mail with a postmark on or before November 3.
- Secure ballot drop boxes are now outside the City Gymnasium and Bowie High School and are being guarded 24/hours a day by the Bowie Police Department.
- Boxes are being installed at the South Bowie Community Center, Bowie State University and the Glenn Dale Community Center.
