COVID Data Trends

The positivity rate dipped slightly today as large numbers of people are getting tested prior to the Thanksgiving holiday; however, the number of cases per 100K persons continues to climb at the county and state levels. The number of new cases across the US is climbing steeply, with about 1 million cases added in the last seven days.

Governor Hogan Press Conference Today

Governor Hogan held a press conference this afternoon to provide an update on the state of COVID-19 in Maryland and to encourage Marylanders to comply with existing orders and advisories.

Conditions in Maryland

- The state has now had 19 straight days with more than 1,000 new cases of the virus, including another 1,658 new cases in the past 24 hours. Today, the statewide 7-day positivity rate is 6.88%.
- COVID hospitalizations have increased by 80% over the past 2 weeks. As of today, 1,276 COVID patients are currently hospitalized. 289 patients are in the ICU (highest level since June 15).
- Some hospitals in Western Maryland are already at their capacity limit, and 29 hospitals across Maryland are at more than 90% capacity.
- Maryland's average case rate has risen to 38.3, up nearly 36% in the past week. 4,293 Marylanders have now died from COVID-19.

The Governor reiterated his previous orders imposed last week:

- A Maryland travel advisory discourages nonessential travel to states with high positivity rates.
- Limitations on visitations to hospitals and nursing homes are back in place to protect patients.
- The statewide masking order remains in effect.
- Restaurants and bars are required to close at 10 p.m., except for food delivery or takeout, which is still permitted.
- Maryland should avoid large gatherings, wear masks, and keep your distance.
- Follow capacity restrictions imposed for restaurants, stores, and other business establishments.

The Governor also announced a **new education, compliance, and enforcement effort** across the state to address the violations being reported.

- The state is launching an all-hands-on-deck compliance, education, and enforcement operation.
- Additional Maryland State troopers will be assigned in every county to work with local officials to investigate any reports of violations of state law.
- Beginning on Thanksgiving-eve, state troopers will support local authorities with compliance checks, with a focus on educating the public about existing orders and protocols, preventing super-spreading events, and assisting in enforcement actions when necessary.



A Look at Nationwide Metrics

The graphic below provides a nationwide look at four key metrics - new tests, new confirmed cases, hospitalizations, and new deaths.



About the Numbers We Report

The figures that are provided in this daily COVID update come from a variety of sources, including the State of Maryland, Prince George's County, and the COVID Tracking Project. City staff use these published sources to track changes in key metrics each day to monitor the current state of the pandemic in our community, and in Prince George's County and Maryland and to monitor trends over time. City officials do not collect or receive patient level information.

Some residents have asked us to report number of cases recovered or the active number of cases at a given time. We cannot share that information because it is not reported on the State or County COVID dashboards. This is likely because of the challenges and effort involved in tracking the recovery of individual patients. In the absence of recovery information, the best way to monitor the current state of COVID-19 in Bowie or in any jurisdiction is to follow the number of new cases being reported each day.

Astra Zeneca/Oxford University Vaccine Update

Following good news about two vaccine trials last week, today, the Astra Zeneca/Oxford University vaccine trial group announced positive results. Their vaccine was shown to be up to 90 percent effective in trials, depending on the dosage given. One advantage of this vaccine is that it requires refrigeration, rather than the deep freeze requirements of the Pfizer and Moderna's vaccines.

Pfizer and Biontech have been working together on a vaccine. They announced recently that they have concluded the Phase 3 Study of their COVID-19 vaccine candidate. Results show it to be 95% effective against COVID-19 beginning 28 days after the first dose. Efficacy was consistent across age, gender, race and ethnicity demographics; and in adults over 65 years of age. The study reports that no serious safety concerns were observed. The companies plan to submit an Emergency Use Authorization application to the FDA soon.

Moderna and the National Institutes of Health (NIH) are also working on development of a vaccine. They are reporting very encouraging progress with their vaccine candidate trial. On November 16, the company announced that preliminary analysis of the trial indicated that the vaccine was 94.5% effective. The trial will continue to gather more results. Moderna says it plans to submit an application for an Emergency Use Authorization within the next few weeks.

COVID Testing

Due to the increasing number of cases and the approaching holiday, more people are getting tested. You may experience longer lines at testing locations, and it may take longer than two days to receive your results.



COVID Link

The Maryland Department of Health launched a new COVID website and a new tool to help notify Marylanders if they have been exposed to the coronavirus. The new COVID-19 Exposure Notifications system is called *MD COVID Alert*. It uses Bluetooth Low Energy technology to quickly notify mobile phone users who might have been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19 with the goal of reducing infections in Maryland. City of Bowie Launches COVID-19 Rental Assistance Program

On November 11, the City of Bowie is launching a COVID-19 Rental Assistance Program for tenants who have suffered a loss of income due to the pandemic. The Rental Assistance Program will provide short term assistance to low- and moderate-income families who meet the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income limit guidelines. If eligible, approved households may receive a maximum of one month's rent (one-time only) paid directly to their landlord.

The COVID-19 Rental Assistance Program is funded through the CARES ACT as a HUD Community Development Block Grant to "prevent, prepare for, and respond to the Coronavirus (COVID-19)". The City has decided to use part of these funds to help those affected by the pandemic to meet their housing obligations and to avoid eviction. Applicants must be US citizens, permanent residents or qualified aliens, (8 U.S.C. 1641), and City of Bowie residents. Visit www.cityofbowie.org/cobcares for more information.

Mental Health Matters!

Mental health concerns have been prevalent in our community as pressures on kids, teens and parents have increased.

Virtual Stakeholders Meeting on New Concept for the Jesuit Property

Discussions are underway about a possible new concept for the property owned by the Society of Jesus

(Jesuits) next to Sacred Heart Church on MD 450. The owners would like to build a retreat center on the site.

The Jesuits approached the City requesting that they host this meeting, as they would like to ensure that the community is aware of their plans and are given an early opportunity to ask questions and present feedback. This meeting will serve as an introduction to the concept of the retreat center, review its proposed programming, discuss traffic impacts, examine conceptual layouts of the site as well as discuss the regulatory and zoning process that would be utilized, if the proposal were to move forward.

The Virtual Stakeholders Meeting will take place on Zoom on Tuesday, December 1, 2020 at 7 p.m. Participants can register to join the call visiting: https://bowie.fyi/retreatctr. All attendees will participate in "listen only" mode but may ask questions during the meeting using the Q&A function in Zoom. City staff will read the submitted questions, as time allows.
