COVID Data Trends

Over 6 million Americans have received both doses and are now fully vaccinated against COVID. Yesterday 14,515 first doses were administered in Maryland and 14,268 second doses were given. Despite the more than 110 vaccination sites statewide, Maryland residents are still having difficulty scheduling appointments.

Six Flags America Mass Vaccination Site

The following information was released this afternoon by the Governor's office:

"The state will open a mass vaccination site tomorrow at Six Flags America through a partnership between the Maryland Department of Health, the Maryland National Guard, and Kaiser Permanente. Governor Hogan will visit the Six Flags site for its soft launch tomorrow morning with Prince George's County Executive Angela Alsobrooks.

In coordination with Prince George's County officials, the state has conducted initial outreach for appointments to a subset of the county's pre-registration list. Once that outreach—which began on Wednesday—is complete, additional appointments through Monday, February 15 will

be made available to all eligible Marylanders. Due to high demand and very limited supply from the federal government, appointments are expected to fill up quickly.

The Maryland National Guard's vaccination teams will provide support for the site. Kaiser Permanente will provide pharmacy services and post-vaccination observation and care.

Vaccinations are by appointment only, and appointments to receive the second dose will be scheduled simultaneously. Patients will not be charged any fees and no insurance information will be collected."

Scheduling a Vaccine Appointment

While supplies of the vaccine are limited, scheduling an appointment will continue to be challenging for those who are eligible as part of Phase 1. Our best advice for those who are currently eligible to be vaccinated in Phase 1 is to explore all options for getting vaccinated and to be persistent. It may seem as if there are no appointments, but we are hearing daily from residents who have been successful in getting vaccinated at the Prince George's County Sports and Learning Complex or at the Bowie Giant.

Vaccination Options

1. **County Health Department Facilities** – Requires pre-registration (see link below). When an appointment is available you will receive an email inviting you to schedule your appointment.
2. **Hospital systems** – University of Maryland, Luminis, MedStar, and Adventist are offering appointments as supplies permit.
3. **Retail pharmacies**, such as Giant and Safeway. (So far, none of the Rite Aid and Walmart locations are in our area).
4. **Maryland Mass Vaccination Locations** – Six sites are planned around the state. The first two open on February 5 at Six Flags in Bowie (see information above) and at the Baltimore Convention Center. For now, it appears that each site will have a different registration process, depending on who the medical partner is for the site.

Prince George's County COVID-19 Vaccine Registration Hotline for Seniors – Dial 3-1-1

The Prince George's County COVID-19 Vaccine Registration Hotline is live for seniors and others who need assistance with pre-registering for a vaccine appointment at a Prince George's County Health Department

location. To access the hotline, dial 311.

All of the online vaccination appointment websites on the [Maryland Vaccine Locator](#) page require an email address for registration. This has been a roadblock for seniors and others who don't have email or have trouble navigating the appointment websites. The hotline does not schedule appointments, but it can provide seniors with a way to bypass the email requirement for pre-registration and scheduling.

This hotline is only for those who need assistance with pre-registering. Please share this information with any seniors in your lives.

Note: Maryland expects to open its own scheduling hotline for mass vaccination locations by February 15.

Seniors and others that wish to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, but have issues accessing the Internet or utilizing technology, should call the County's COVID-19 Vaccine Registration Hotline.



As appointments become available based on vaccine supply, staff will follow up with individuals who have pre-registered to schedule appointments via phone.

Hotline staff will provide assistance with completing the vaccine pre-registration form.



Due to limited supplies of vaccines, it may take several weeks or longer for eligible individuals to receive vaccine appointments.



If you are able to complete the pre-registration form online by yourself, please do not call the hotline, so we can ensure it remains available for Prince Georgians who need assistance with registering.

CVS Partners with Federal Government to Administer More Vaccines to Maryland and Other States

Beginning on Thursday, February 11, CVS pharmacies will begin providing COVID-19 vaccinations at 18 locations in Maryland, including Baltimore, Bowie, Chester, Frederick, Fulton, Hagerstown, Ocean City, and

Rockville. Appointments will become available for booking as early as **Tuesday, February 9**. These CVS pharmacies will be receiving vaccines directly from the federal government as part of a new Federal Retail Pharmacy Program and will be in addition to the state's regular vaccine allocation.
