Mask Requirement Eased for Vaccinated Individuals

On the evening of April 30, Prince George's County modified its mask order to align more closely with new face coverings guidance issued recently by the CDC.

In Prince George's County, vaccinated individuals are no longer required to wear masks when outdoors walking, running, hiking, or biking or in small gatherings with members of their household or other fully vaccinated people. Unvaccinated people are strongly encouraged to get vaccinated and to continue wearing masks outdoors until they are fully vaccinated.

Masks are still required at outdoor ticketed events and in all indoor venues, including retail establishments, and while on public transportation.

Despite Maryland lifting some capacity restrictions, Prince George's County capacity limits have not changed. The following restrictions remain in place in Prince George's County:

- Indoor gatherings are limited to a maximum of 20 persons and outdoor gatherings are limited to a maximum of 50 persons.
- Restaurants: Indoor and outdoor dining is allowed at 50% of maximum capacity. Restaurants must ensure social distancing and mask-wearing is observed.
- Theaters: 50% of maximum capacity.
- Gyms/Fitness Centers: Open at 50% of maximum capacity. Face coverings must be worn over the nose and mouth when working out.
- Banquet Halls, Receptions and Meeting Rooms: 50% of maximum capacity, applicable to the specific room where the event will be held.
- Houses of Worship: Indoor services are authorized up to 50% of maximum capacity, with social distancing requirements in place. Outdoor services are allowed up to 50% maximum capacity of the outdoor area, with social distancing and access to hand washing or hand sanitizers in place. Masks must be worn.
- Personal Services: 50% of maximum capacity. These establishments must operate by appointment only.
- Retail: 50% of maximum capacity.
- Businesses and other establishments must continue following all other safety guidelines, including the enforcement of wearing masks and social distancing.

Update on the Status of the Bowie Senior Center

The Bowie Senior Center is currently being used as a critical vaccine clinic two days a week. That operation will continue for several more weeks. If you are not vaccinated yet, please take advantage of this convenient opportunity to get protected. (Visit www.cityofbowie.org/vax or call 301-262-6200.)

Maryland is taking steps to begin reopening some senior centers across the state. They will be opening a few centers soon and will watch them closely to make sure they are operating safely and not causing outbreaks. Gradually they will allow more centers to open. We await guidance from the Maryland Department of Aging about how that will occur.

To prepare for that day, staff has developed a re-opening plan, which we will implement when we are able. When the Bowie Senior Center does reopen, the Center will operate with COVID-19 safety protocols in place. That means we will require temperature checks and will ask health screening questions. Participants will be required to wear a face mask at all times, maintain six feet of social distancing between others, and wash hands frequently. Reservations will be required for many programs and activities and the group activities that do occur will be very limited in size.

Hydrant Flushing Continues thru May 4

The City of Bowie Public Works Department will finish the Spring fire hydrant flushing and testing program in areas served by City water according to the schedule below (hours, 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.):

- May 3 Whitehall
- May 4 Rockledge

Some discoloration of your water may occur, and clothes washing is discouraged. If your clothes become discolored, keep them wet and re-wash them using a rust remover. Rust remover will be available, at no cost, from City Hall and Public Works offices. The water is safe for drinking and bathing even though it may be discolored. The discoloration is a result of rust and sediment build up in the water lines and is not harmful. The discoloration should clear in approximately 24 hours. However, since the water mains are all interconnected, flushing of hydrants in adjacent

Lawn Mower Rebate Program

Buying a new mower? Let us help! City residents* who purchase a new mulching, electric, or manual reel mower are eligible to receive a \$50 rebate from the City of Bowie. To obtain your cash rebate, bring proof of municipal residency* and the receipt for a mulching, electric, or manual reel mower to the Finance Department at City Hall, 15901 Excalibur Road. If the receipt does not specify that the mower is one of these three types, please also bring a manual or other documentation for the mower. Finance Department hours are Monday - Friday, 8:30 a.m. - 5 p.m. Rebates are limited to one per household. If you have questions, please call **301-809-3020**. **Only those who live within the municipal limits of the City of Bowie are eligible to receive this rebate. Having a Bowie mailing address does not necessarily mean that you live within the City of Bowie limits.*

If a solicitor cannot provide a City Permit, we ask that you refrain from doing business with them. Moving Your Dog to a New Home

Dogs relocating to a new environment often become depressed and confused, which creates the desire to run away. When moving, it's important to bring with you all your dog's toys, food bowls, treats, blankets etc. Pay close attention to your pet and walk your pet throughout the premises both indoors and out. Never let your dog outdoors unsupervised until they seem to have adjusted to the new home. If you have any questions or concerns, please call Bowie Animal Control at 301-809-3002.

New Rental License Requirements.

The City Council passed an amendment to the City Code on January 4, 2021 removing the exemptions from the rental license requirements. All rental situations now require the property to have a valid City of Bowie rental license and inspection. This includes rentals where the owner or a family member live at the property, basement or partial rental and short-term rentals like Airbnb®, VRBO® or Home Away®. The annual license costs \$110 and a satisfactory inspection is a condition of the license and renewal. For information, visit www.cityofbowie.org/rentalhousing or call 301-809-3008.

Planning a Home Improvement?

Are you planning a home improvement? Many common home improvements require Prince George's County and City of Bowie building permits to ensure proper construction and community standards. Even when replacing an existing structure, both permits may be required. Projects requiring permits include additions, decks, driveway extension or replacement with different material, fences, porches (new or enclosing), signs, sheds and solar panels. Failing to obtain permits can be very expensive and frustrating, especially when a structure must be removed because it does not comply with County or City standards. Don't take a chance; check before you build. You'll need to allow time for permit review from the County and the City prior to beginning work. Anyone Age 16+ Can Get Vaccinated at Bowie's Vaccination Clinic

The City of Bowie's vaccination clinic at the Bowie Senior Center is quick and convenient. Any individual age 16 and up is eligible to get vaccinated there. Appointments are now being scheduled on Sundays and Wednesdays. **Depending on the number of booked appointments and cancellations and no-shows, walk-in appointments are sometimes available.** Please make sure to sign up for Alert Bowie or follow the City of Bowie on social media to receive the latest information on walk-in vaccination availability.

Pre-register now at www.cityofbowie.org/vax (or 301-262-6200) and you'll receive a call to schedule your appointment, usually within 24 hours. Several City staff members are calling pre-registrants to schedule vaccine appointments. The calls may come from a number you don't recognize. Please be sure to take the call or check your voicemail so you don't miss your scheduling opportunity. **Currently, all appointments are for the Pfizer vaccine.**

Mass Vaccination Sites

When someone is diagnosed positive with COVID-19, the Health Department makes a phone call to that person within 24 hours. When you see MD COVID on your caller ID, please answer so the Health Department can help you with managing your condition, and with getting you resources that you need. If you don't have caller ID, look for the phone number 240-466-4488.

The Health Department will also ask who you might have been in contact with, so that they can be offered the same resources and minimize the spread of COVID-19. They will never ask for personal information from you, like your social security number or a bank account number. For
