COVID Brief

Yesterday, COVID cases were down in all 50 states for the first time since the pandemic began. The US case rate for May 17 was 17,724, which was the lowest rate since the pandemic began. US hospitalizations are down 18% in the last week. In Maryland, two-thirds of Maryland adults have now received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.

Interested in getting a Johnson & Johnson vaccine? The mass vaccination site at the Greenbelt Metro Station is offering "one and done" Johnson and Johnson vaccinations until the end of the month when the site will be closing. Prince George's County Vaccination Data as Reported by the CDC

The CDC is now reporting vaccination data by county, which allows for county level comparisons across the US. The data is broken down differently than vaccination rates on the covidvax.maryland.gov website in that the CDC data presents percentage of the **eligible** population, rather than percentage of **total population** as the Maryland site uses.

City of Bowie Reopenings

The City of Bowie is implementing the following changes, as a result of Prince George's County lifting all capacity and social distancing restrictions on May 17.

- Full practices and competitions can resume on city fields and at the Bowie Gymnasium.
- Outdoor basketball hoops have returned to city parks.
- Picnic areas at Allen Pond and Whitemarsh Park can once again be booked to their full capacity.
- Temperature taking, health screening questions, waivers and masks are still required for inside venues.

City Hall will remain closed, however, the service windows in the Lobby will be open for animal control, code enforcement, rental licenses, and water bill payments. The police department lobby will also be open for obtaining police reports, paying speed cameras, and conducting other police department business. Planning is currently underway to partially reopen the Bowie Senior Center by June 1.

Prince George's County Reopening Updates – Masks Still Required Indoors

Effective Monday 17 at 5:01 p.m., Prince George's County aligned with the State of Maryland and lifted capacity and distancing restrictions for all indoor and outdoor venues. [County Order](#)


- All indoor and outdoor venues in Prince George's County may resume normal operations.
- **Face masks are still required for all indoor venues, while on public transportation, and at crowded outdoor venues including concert venues and ticketed sporting events**
- The County will consider future changes to mask requirements based on key COVID-19 metrics and vaccination rates among County residents.

Comparison of Current Mask Directives

With key metrics declining across the US and locally, last week government officials took major steps toward a return to normalcy. They eased capacity restrictions and other social distancing requirements and, in some cases, eased the mask wearing directives. The relevant changes are summarized below.

Despite the progress being made and the easing of restrictions, leaders at all levels of government, continue to stress the importance of vaccinations in controlling future spread of COVID-19. They urge all eligible persons who are not yet been vaccinated, to do so as soon as possible.

Prince George's County plans to close a section of Church Road from Mary Bowie Parkway to Dormansville Boulevard from June 2021 through December 2021 to complete needed repairs and enhancements to the roadway and supporting infrastructure.

Expired MVA Products Must be Renewed

The Executive Order that has covered all expired driver's and business licenses, identification cards, permits (including disability parking permits) is expiring. The Maryland Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Administration [announced](#) that customers with expired MDOT MVA products from March 12, 2020 must take care of these transactions by the dates below:

- Expired vehicle registrations, business licenses, disability parking permits, and other vehicle-related products must be renewed by June 30, 2021.
- Expired driver's license, CDL, and identification cards must be renewed by August 15, 2021.

Emergency Broadband Benefit Program Offers Aid to Eligible Households

The Federal Communications Commission has launched a temporary program to help families and households struggling to afford Internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Emergency Broadband Benefit provides a discount of up to \$50 per month toward broadband service for eligible households. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers.

Eligible households can enroll through a participating broadband provider or directly with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) using an online or mail in application. Learn more about eligibility and enrollment information at www.fcc.gov/broadbandbenefit or by calling 833-511-0311.

IRS Child Tax Credit

The IRS and the U.S. Department of the Treasury announced that the first monthly payment of the expanded and newly-advanceable Child Tax Credit from the American Rescue Plan will be made on July 15. Roughly 39 million households, covering 88% of children in the U.S. are estimated to be eligible to begin receiving monthly payments without any further action required.

Payments will be made on the 15th of each month unless it falls on a weekend or holiday. Eligible families will receive a payment of up to \$300 per month for each child under the age six and up to \$250 per month for each child age six and above.
