COVID Brief

Effective Friday, 5/28 at 5 p.m., the Prince George's County mask order is lifted. Details on this change are provided below. Declining Prince George's County COVID metrics over the last month have made this change possible. Throughout the pandemic, Prince George's County experienced higher numbers of cases, more community spread, and more deaths than the statewide average. Only recently, have the metrics been more in line with statewide numbers.

The Bowie Senior Center Vaccination Clinic continues to provide free Pfizer vaccinations to anyone age 12 and up on Sundays and Wednesdays. Sign up for first or second dose shots at www.cityofbowie.org/vax or call City Hall at 301-262-6200 for assistance.

County Executive Provides COVID Update and Lifts Mask Order on 5/28

Today, Prince George's County Executive Alsobrooks announced that the **County mask order will be lifted as of Friday, May 28 at 5 p.m.** Masks will no longer be required by County law. The only exceptions will be on public transportation, in schools and daycares, and in healthcare settings. Individual businesses or organizations can still maintain more strict requirements if they prefer to do so. Unvaccinated individuals are strongly urged to continue wearing masks and get vaccinated as soon as possible. With this move, the County will fully align itself with CDC and Maryland guidance related to face coverings.

The County Executive asked residents to be respectful of those who may not be ready to remove masks and of businesses and organizations that may still ask customers or visitors to cover their faces in order to enter their premises.

COVID metrics in Prince George's County continue to decline as vaccination rates increase:

- The positivity rate is at 1.9%, which is the lowest since the start of the pandemic.
- New cases have declined 85% since January.
- The case rate per 100,000 individuals is down to 4.8 cases, which indicates a substantial decrease in community transmission.
- COVID hospitalizations have declined 60% in the last month.

County vaccination operations are changing. Walk-ins are now welcome at the County clinics at the Sports and Learning Center in Landover and at the Southern Regional Technology and Recreation Complex in Oxon Hill; appointments can also be scheduled if preferred. The vaccination clinic in Cheverly has closed and the clinic at the Laurel- Beltsville Senior Center will close on 5/28. Mobile vaccine clinics will continue around the county and vaccination ambassadors are going door to door in hard hit neighborhoods to help residents get vaccinated and connect to other support services.

In other County news...

- Park and Planning community centers and parks are offering a host of activities this summer for youth. They have also teamed up with the Bowie Baysox to offer movie nights in the stadium parking lot, starting 6/4 with the Avengers Movie. The cost is \$30/per car and space is limited. - The eviction moratorium remains in effect for those whose loss of income is related to the pandemic.

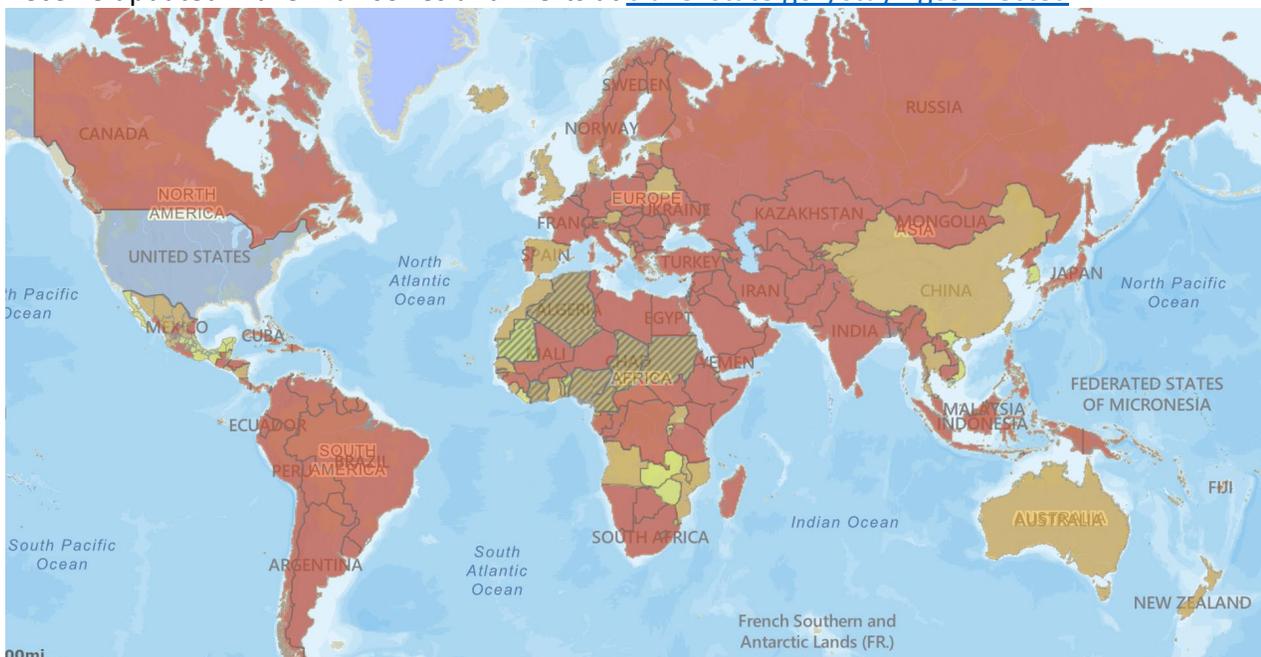
State Department Travel Guidance

The State Department has issued a Level 4: Do Not Travel notice for Japan two months ahead of the Tokyo Olympics due to a very high level of COVID-19 in the country. In addition to Japan, there are Level 3 or Level 4 advisories issued for a large majority of the world's countries.

Travel Advisories are issued for each country of the world with a color corresponding to each level:

- Level 1 - Exercise Normal Precautions [Blue]
- Level 2 - Exercise Increased Caution [Yellow]
- Level 3 - Reconsider Travel [Orange]
- Level 4 – Do Not Travel [Red]
