## COVID Brief

Maryland's daily COVID-19 positivity rate has dipped under 1% for the first time, reaching a record-low of 0.74% today and bringing the 7-day statewide positivity rate to 1.39%.

For those still in need of a vaccine, [Uber](#) and [Lyft](#) are offering **free** rides to and from vaccination sites. Additionally, as of June 2 [KinderCare](#), [Learning Care Group](#), and hundreds of [YMCA](#) locations are offering free drop-in child care for parents who require childcare while going to get vaccinated.

Vaccines are also available through 723 pharmacy locations across the state. A complete list of vaccine providers in the state—including those providing Pfizer for individuals aged 12 to 17— can be found at [covidvax.maryland.gov](https://covidvax.maryland.gov). Beginning next week, select vaccination sites will be offering extended hours during the month of June, including pharmacies that will operate on 24 hour schedule each Friday.

This upcoming weekend, designated as National Canvassing Weekend, will include thousands of volunteers knocking on doors to encourage community members to get vaccinated. Individuals can go to [WeCanDoThis.HHS.gov](https://WeCanDoThis.HHS.gov), to learn about and sign up for volunteer opportunities.

### Governor Announces Phased Demobilization of Mass Vaccination Sites

Governor Larry Hogan today announced that the state's mass vaccination sites have begun a phased demobilization process as local demand changes and additional resources are directed to mobile clinics and community-based activities. In the coming weeks, several sites will stop offering first doses of the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines. Once first doses are no longer available, the sites will offer second doses only. The state has worked with local partners to identify providers for first doses of Pfizer. Most sites will also continue to offer the one-shot Johnson & Johnson Janssen vaccine until the site closes.

Operational responsibilities at several mass vaccination sites will shift from the state to local partners, while other sites will close. For as long as they remain in operation, all sites will continue to offer no-appointment vaccinations.

### Vaccination Resources

- **State of Maryland** - To get vaccinated—and be eligible for the state's [\\$2 million Vax Cash Promotion](#)—visit [covidvax.maryland.gov](#), or call 1-855-MD-GOVAX (1-855-634-6829). The call center is available seven days a week, from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. A limited number of drive-thru, no-appointment vaccinations are available at the state-run Six Flags mass vaccination site, Monday to Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- **Prince George's County** - Appointments are no longer necessary at all COVID-19 vaccine clinics operated by the County Health Department. Individuals who live or work in the County can walk up to County Health Department vaccination clinics with no appointment needed or book an appointment in advance online at [mypgc.us/COVIDVaccine](#). You can also use the County's

[County Vaccine Locator](#) to find additional vaccination sites operated by pharmacies, hospitals and other healthcare partners.

- **City of Bowie** – Appointments are available at the Bowie Senior Center Vaccination Clinic, which operates on Sundays and Wednesdays. Sign up at [www.cityofbowie.org](http://www.cityofbowie.org) or call City Hall at 301-262-6200 for assistance.
