COVID Brief

Maryland health officials are reporting fewer than 100 new coronavirus cases for the fourth time in seven days and the state positivity rate continues to remain under 1%. The County's positivity rate has been in the 1% range for 20 days. COVID hospitalizations are at the lowest level they have been since March 2020.

The CDC vaccination data by county is broken down differently than vaccination rates on the covidvax.maryland.gov website in that the CDC data presents percentage of the **eligible** population, rather than percentage of **total population** as the Maryland site uses.

Mass Vax Sites are Demobilizing as Focus Shifts to Pharmacies, Healthcare Providers and Local Clinics

Operational responsibilities at several mass vaccination sites will shift from the state to local partners, while other sites will close. View the full schedule for mass vaccination sites demobilization [here](#).

Vaccination Resources

- **State of Maryland** - To get vaccinated and be eligible for the state's [\\$2 million Vax Cash Promotion](#) visit covidvax.maryland.gov, or call 1-855-MD-GOVAX (1-855-634-6829). The call center is available seven days a week, from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. for assistance. The Six Flags mass-vaccination site will close operations on July 17.
- **Prince George's County** - Appointments are not necessary at the two COVID-19 vaccine clinics operated by the County Health Department. Individuals who live or work in the County can walk into the sites or if they prefer, appointments can be booked in advance at mypgc.us/COVIDVaccine. You can also use the County's [County Vaccine Locator](#) to find additional vaccination sites operated by pharmacies, hospitals and other healthcare partners.

Through Tuesday, June 15, Prince George's County Public Schools students 12 years of age and older and their families can receive a COVID-19 vaccine at select high schools from 1:30 - 5:30 p.m. [Info](#)

- **City of Bowie** – The Bowie Senior Center Vaccination Clinic will cease operations on June 30. Second dose vaccinations are available on Sundays and Wednesdays until then. No first dose appointments are being scheduled, though walk-in may be available. Call City Hall at 301-262-6200 for more information and watch social media or the city website for walk-in announcements.

Maryland and the Orioles Team Up to Offer Vaccinations at Camden Yards This Weekend

The Orioles next homestand begins Friday, June 18. Not only will the team be welcoming fans for games on Father's Day weekend, they'll also be making it easy for anyone 18+ to get their COVID-19 vaccinations at the stadium.

Vaccinations will be offered at Dempsey's Brew Pub & Restaurant, located along the Eutaw Street promenade. Fans can access Dempsey's through the non-ballpark (East) side of the B&O Warehouse. All adults age 18 and over are eligible to receive a vaccine at one of the six available dates during the homestand, beginning four hours prior to first pitch until approximately one-and-a-half hours after first pitch. The vaccine being offered will be the one-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine, which is currently approved for people ages 18 years and over.

All fans age 18 and over who choose to receive the vaccine at Oriole Park will receive a voucher good for two complimentary Lower Level tickets, redeemable for any game through July 11. Fans may redeem their voucher by presenting it at the Main Box Office, located at the north end of the Warehouse by Gate H.

Game tickets are not required to receive a COVID-19 vaccine at Oriole Park. Appointments are encouraged but not required, and walk-ups will be accommodated. Schedule a ballpark appointment by visiting orioles.com/vaccine. Fans must wear a mask during their vaccination appointment. Marylanders who get vaccinated between now and July 4 will be eligible for the state's [\\$2 million Vax Cash Promotion](#). The sooner you get vaccinated, the safer you are, and the more chances you have to win.

Weekly COVID Tracker for June 2 – June 8

The latest COVID Tracker report was released by the CDC on 6/11. It compares trends from week to week. Here are a few of the highlights for the period June 2 – June 8:

- Screening for COVID variants shows that 69% of the samples tested contain the UK variant.
- Nationwide vaccination rates:
 - 51.9% of US population have at least one dose of vaccine
 - 42.6% of US population are fully vaccinated
- The number of people getting vaccinated decreased 13.87% last week.
- COVID hospitalizations are down 12.8%.
- Despite mostly good news, COVID-related deaths increased 1.9% nationwide in the last week.
