



Daily COVID-19 Update for Monday, August 30, 2021

Approximately 61% of all Marylanders are now fully vaccinated, which places Maryland among the top ten states for vaccination rates.

Vaccine Boosters for Immune Compromised Individuals

Those with moderately to severely compromised immune systems are now eligible to receive vaccine boosters. Check with your healthcare provider about your eligibility.

“[Studies](#) show some immunocompromised people don’t always build the same level of immunity after vaccination the way non-immunocompromised people do. When this happens, getting another dose of the vaccine can sometimes help them build more protection against the disease. CDC recommends that people with moderately to severely compromised immune systems receive an additional (third) dose of a COVID-19 mRNA ([Pfizer-BioNTech](#) or [Moderna](#)) vaccine after the initial 2-doses. People who are moderately to severely immunocompromised are at increased risk of serious, prolonged illness due to COVID-19. In small [studies](#), fully vaccinated immunocompromised people have made up a large proportion of hospitalized “[breakthrough infections](#).”
