



# COVID-19 NUMBERS

## Daily COVID-19 Update for Wednesday, September 22, 2021

The Maryland COVID-19 website is now reporting breakthrough cases. Over 3.4 million people have been vaccinated in Maryland and 18,000 have tested positive after being fully vaccinated. The breakthrough cases represent 0.05% of the vaccinated population in Maryland. Another way of saying this is that 99.5% of fully vaccinated people in the state have not been infected with COVID after vaccination. Since January 2021, 90% of all confirmed COVID cases in the state have been among the unvaccinated.

The zip code level vaccination data has been updated on the state website. All four Bowie zip codes now have at least 60% of the total population fully vaccinated.

### Free Seasonal Flu Shot Clinic

An annual seasonal flu vaccine is the best way to protect against the flu. This year the city is partnering with University of Maryland Capital Region Health to host a FREE flu shot clinic at the Bowie Senior Center. Only the regular dose flu vaccine will be available at this drive-thru clinic.

### How the drive-thru clinic works:

- Flu shots will be available for adults and children ages 3 and older
- Vaccines will be provided on a first-come first-served basis
- Participants should wear clothing that allows easy access to your upper arm
- Everyone 3 years and older must wear a face mask
- Minors (under 18) will require a parent/guardian signature of consent
- No walk-ups. This is strictly a drive-thru event.
- This clinic is free to all participants.

The higher dose version of the flu shot for seniors will not be available at this clinic but will be offered at a high-dose clinic on October 11, from 9 a.m. to noon. Call the Senior Center at 301-8809-2300 to reserve your spot.

Each participant must wear a mask over their nose and mouth at all times. Please do not attend if you are feeling sick, even with mild symptoms. Because a flu shot does not protect against COVID-19, and a COVID-19 vaccine does not protect against flu, it is important to get both shots. You can get a flu shot no matter how recently you may have had a COVID-19 shot.

Influenza is a serious illness that affects millions of Americans every year. An annual flu shot can reduce illness and hospitalizations, protect pregnant women and be lifesaving for children. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends an annual flu vaccine for everyone ages 6 months and older.

### **Johnson & Johnson Two-Shot Study**

Johnson & Johnson conducted a study of how effective two shots of its vaccine would be in protecting from COVID-19. The company reported this week that their results show the vaccine is 94% effective in preventing symptomatic infection, beginning two months after the second shot is administered.
