Prince George's Health Department Expands Opportunities for Vaccinations

Prince George's County Health Department has extended the operating hours at the vaccination clinic located at the Sports and Learning Complex in Landover until 7 p.m. on Fridays, and until 6 p.m. on Sundays. The Health Department has also added elementary school clinics to expand COVID-19 vaccine access.

Some Facts about the Pfizer Vaccine for Children Ages 5 -11

- The Pfizer vaccine for children ages 5 through 11 has the same active ingredients as the vaccine given to adults and adolescents.
- The vaccine for children comes in a different vial with a different color cap.
- The Pfizer vaccine that is given to adults and adolescents cannot be used for children ages 5 through 11 years. Children ages 5 through 11 will receive an age-appropriate dose that is one third of what adolescents and adults receive.
- Smaller needles, designed specifically for children, are used for children ages 5 through 11 years. COVID-19 vaccine dosage does not vary by patient weight but by age on the day of vaccination. Children are still required to get two doses three weeks apart to be considered fully vaccinated.

- There is no evidence that any vaccines, including COVID-19 vaccines, can cause female or male fertility problems.
- COVID-19 vaccines are available at no cost to all eligible persons living in the US, regardless of insurance or immigration status.

PGCPS Will Host Mobile Vax Clinics for Students

Prince George's County Schools have announced a series of school-based COVID vaccination clinics for students ages 5 and up. The first Bowie clinic is scheduled for November 18, from 4 -8 p.m. at Bowie High School. - Vaccine distribution will be done through pediatric offices, schools, pharmacies, and county health departments.
- Visit <http://covidvax.maryland.gov> or call 1-855-MDGOVAX for assistance in finding a vaccination location near you.
- The number of pediatric cases in the state has been growing over the last few months and now makes up 14% of cases.
- Since the pandemic began, there have been over 700 pediatric hospitalizations in Maryland.
- Recent studies have shown that the Pfizer vaccine is 90.7% effective in preventing symptomatic COVID infections among 5–11-year-olds.
- The dosage is smaller (one-third of adult dosage) and requires a two-shot regimen, three weeks apart.

Rapid Re-Employment Grants Available to Businesses Hiring Unemployed Residents

Employ Prince George's Rapid Re-Employment Grants provide funding for companies that hire unemployed Prince George's County residents and supplement a portion of their new hires' salary. Grants are awarded on the first day of a new employee's first day of work, and the maximum grant per new employee is \$15,000.
