Don't Make it Easy for Criminals

The Bowie Police Department is again seeing more thefts from autos.. Please make sure that you are not making your car an easy target for criminals.

- Stay with your car while it warms up.
- Remove valuables from the car.

- Make sure you have your keys or key fob when you get out of your car.
- Lock it and then pull the handle to double check that it is really locked.
 (Remember -- if you leave a key fob in the car, it won't lock AND if your key fob is inside but still close to your vehicle, it may prevent the lock from engaging.)

Updated Mask Guidance

The rapid spread of the omicron variant has refocused attention on the importance of masking as a critical health tool in preventing the spread of COVID-19.

On January 14, the CDC updated its mask guidance to provide more specific information about different types of masks and how to wear them. the CDC says that respirators, such as N95 and KN95, offer "the highest level of protection". The CDC also clarified that it is now acceptable for individuals to use respirators regularly, since there are few concerns about supply shortages. Wearing a highly protective mask or respirator may be most important for certain higher risk situations, or by some people at increased risk for severe disease.

COVID Testing

Testing continues to be an important component in the strategy to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Below is a summary of current testing options:

At-home testing

- Request a test kit through the federal government <u>COVID Home Tests | USPS</u>
- Pick up a test kit at one of the local distribution points at certain libraries and community centers. See this week's list.
- Purchase a test with the help of your health insurance company. As of January 15, 2022, private insurance companies are required to cover at-home COVID-19 tests. Insurance companies and health plans are required to cover eight free at-home tests per covered individual per month. Contact your provider for details.

Testing is free. Sites are walk-in, unless otherwise noted. Sites may be affected by weather-related closures. Hours are subject to change. Be sure to check before you go.

Please note: At present, the City of Bowie does not have COVID test kits for distribution to the public. The City has made a request through Prince George's County to receive some of the kits that Maryland has secured. We are awaiting a response to the request. If Bowie receives an allocation, information about distribution will be shared widely.

American Red Cross Declares Blood Crisis

The American Red Cross has declared the first-ever Blood Crisis amid the Omicron surge. The agency stated that it is facing a national blood crisis, its worst blood shortage in over a decade, posing a concerning risk to patient care. Amid this crisis, doctors have been forced to make difficult decisions about who receives blood transfusions and who will need to wait until more products become available. Source

Vaccinations

State officials continue to urge all eligible Marylanders to get vaccinated for COVID and the flu and get their booster shots just as soon as they are eligible.

COVID-19 vaccination operations have returned to the Wayne K. Curry Sports and Learning Complex. Appointments are preferred, but limited walk-in-hours are available. Vaccinations are also available at pharmacies throughout the area, usually by appointment.



Facts and Misconceptions About the COVID Omicron Surge

THE FACTS

The surge in COVID hospitalization is driven by unvaccinated and unboosted patients.





HOSPITALS ARE OVERWHELMED:

COVID hospitalizations are 50% higher than the 2021 peak.

FEWER STAFF TO CARE FOR

PATIENTS: Hospitals are caring for COVID and non-COVID patients with 20% fewer employees than last year.

WE KNOW HOW TO FIGHT THE

VIRUS: Vaccines, including boosters, masking and social distancing are proven strategies to slow the spread and prevent hospitalization and death.

MASKS MATTER: When PPE supplies were tight, any mask helped slow the spread. Today, masks that fit and filter better (like N95/KN95) are preferred and widely available.

THE MISCONCEPTIONS

I hear that people who get omicron are less likely to be hospitalized. It is not as dangerous as delta or other waves of COVID. Wrong. Omicron is already overwhelming Maryland hospitals. Some studies say omicron comes with about a third of the risk of hospitalization as delta, but because the omicron variant is much more infectious than delta (2.7 to 3.7 times more infectious, by one estimate), many more people are ending up in the hospital over a shorter period of time.

If I am vaccinated or boosted, it does not really matter if I get COVID. Omicron is not as dangerous as delta and it is spreading so fast that I am going to get it eventually anyway. Wrong again. Although COVID may be mild for you, you will probably pass it on and the person you give it to could experience severe illness. When the virus spreads out of control,

we are all at risk. Nurses, doctors and health care workers who are infected at home or outside the hospital will not be available to care for patients. Meanwhile, airline pilots, bus drivers, grocery store workers, teachers, police officers, firefighters and everyone else who provides critical services and keeps us safe will also be out sick – creating not just inconveniences, but dangerous conditions for us all

I keep hearing different things about COVID. The advice from experts on testing, masks, vaccines and quarantines keeps changing and I do not know what to believe anymore. It is true that guidance has changed a few

It is true that guidance has changed a rew times during the pandemic. As we learn about COVID, new variants of the virus and how people react to the pandemic, new advice comes along as the science evolves. It is a sign that we are getting better at fighting it.

The COVID omicron surge will not last long. Everyone says it will be over in a few weeks. Let's hope it doesn't last long. Just remember that every bed taken by a COVID patient is one less bed to deliver lifesaving care for people with cancer, heart disease or who have been through trauma like a car crash. As of 1/6/2022, there were about 3,200 COVID patients in Maryland hospitals and 4,600 non-COVID patients getting care. As COVID patients take more beds, people with other life-threatening illnesses could end up waiting much, much longer for care.
